## DRESS CODE



### **Dress appropriately for an academic setting**

Students should wear clothing that reflects the academic nature of our building where we come to learn, socialize and work in a diverse community. It is expected that students wear neat, clean, and properly fitting clothing at all times. The purpose of the dress code is to foster an atmosphere that encourages students to show that their daily activities at LPHS are important to each of them as individuals. The school administration reserves the right to define what attire is “appropriate” within the context of the school.

The following list contains some (but not limited to) guidelines, to help students and parents/guardians make wise choices about what attire is appropriate for school:

- Clothing/jewelry should not depict offensive language, gang culture, drugs, alcohol, racist or sexist messages.
- Top garments must meet the waistline of pants and sides of chest must be covered
- Strapless tops are not permitted.
- Bottom garments must be worn at the waistline and length of bottom garment must cover 2.5 inches below the buttocks.
- Undergarments must not be visible.
- Pajamas do not show respect for the academic nature of our building.
- Hats /bandanas/hoods/etc. (except for religious attire) are not to be worn in the building
- Outdoor jackets and backpacks are not to be worn/brought to class or the cafeteria

If a student’s manner of dress is deemed inappropriate by administration:

- *Students will be expected to change your clothes to reflect the expectations set out in this code of conduct*
- *The student may be given a piece of clothing by the office to cover what they are wearing*
- *If deemed necessary, the student may be sent home to change their garments*

Consequences:

- Students may receive one or more detentions
- Repeat offenders may be sent home with a letter
- Suspension
- Unauthorized head gear will be withheld – administration will decide when the student may have it back
