DRESS CODE

Dress appropriately for an academic setting

Students should wear clothing that reflects a positive learning environment, free from distractions. It is expected that students wear neat, clean, and properly fitting clothing at all times. The school administration reserves the right to define what attire is “appropriate” within the context of the school.

The following list contains some (but not limited to) guidelines, to help students and parents/guardians make wise choices about what attire is appropriate for school:

- Clothing/jewelry which depict rude, vulgar, racist, sexist or violent slogans (as deemed by administration) is not acceptable
- Men’s sleeveless undershirts and girls’ spaghetti straps are NOT acceptable
- As a guide, skirts and shorts must fall below fingertip length
- Midriffs must be covered at all times
- Undergarments should not be visible. Pants must be worn at the waistline
- Pajamas are not acceptable unless approved for a special school activity.
- Footwear must be worn at all times on school property
- Hats/tuques/bandanas/visors/etc. (except for religious attire) are not to be worn in the school
- All tops of a revealing nature are not permitted at school
- You will be told to go to the appropriate office by a teacher, staff member or administration

If you dress inappropriately:

- You will be expected to change your clothes
 - The student may be given a piece of clothing by the office to cover what they are wearing
 - Parents/guardians may be called to bring the student appropriate attire
 - The student may be sent home to change their clothing

Consequences:

- You will receive one or more detentions
- Repeat offenders will be sent home with a letter
- Suspension
- Unauthorized head gear will be withheld – administration will decide when the student may have it back
